

1. Golden Retriever Rescue of Fairbank's mission is to rescue unwanted and abandoned dogs and place them into loving homes, to promote and provide education about dogs, their care, obedience, and behavior, and to promote spaying and neutering to address Alaska's pet overpopulation problem.

2. GRRF's work closely follows the Co-op Market's values of service, social responsibility, and sustainability. GRRF is made entirely of dedicated volunteers who work tirelessly to provide and serve our community's dogs in need. We work with other rescues, both locally and statewide, in an attempt to make our work as efficient and impactful as possible. We work with the borough shelter to take in dogs that may have a better chance outside of that system and in turn create more space for other dogs that better fit their capabilities. When we have the privilege to work with underserved populations who may not have access to veterinary care, we do what we can to help provide this at little to no cost. This in turn helps us as we are able to get more intact animals fixed as well as reduce the spread of diseases by providing this care where it might otherwise be inaccessible.

3. If chosen to be a recipient of the Lend a Hand program, GRRF will use the funds to help offset the cost of our veterinary care. GRRF's veterinary care can be quite expensive with the volume and quantity preformed. GRRF believes this cost should not be put onto new adoptive families and instead fundraises to help cover anything additional that is not covered by our adoption fee.
